A defined area in which the local businesses have voted to invest together to improve their environment.

Business Improvement **D**istricts provide additional or improved services, identified by the local businesses.

One of the first BIDs in the UK 2005

BID Business Plan is set for a 5 years term.

The Levy is based on non-domestic rateable value of above £6,000 per year.

Our smallest businesses pay around £100 per year



Voting Requirements

Minimum turnout = 25%

Of those that vote:
Over 50% must be in favour
Over 50% rateable value


Over the Past Term

The levy generates £2.2 million
BUT we used this to generate £4.5
million to spend on supporting
businesses in the city centre

For every £1 of levy income received LBIG secured a further £2 to invest in the city

Of the £4.5 million invested in the city, £3.6 million came from external funding.

Employees saved £1.45 million over the past term on Car Park and Bus permits.
